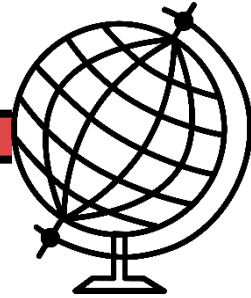


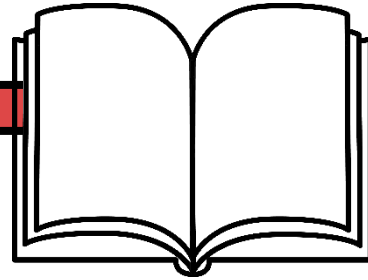
SOMETHING I CAN DO

- Discuss race and racism with your students & children (use this article as a guide)



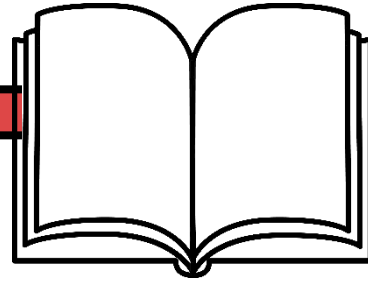

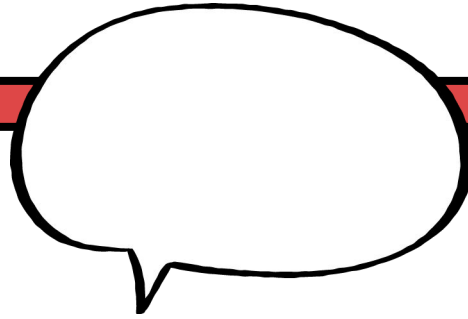

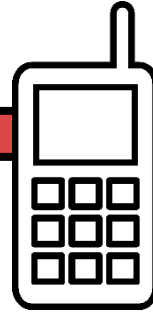
SOMETHING I CAN SAY

- “Your experience is not my experience, tell me more about what it has been like for you.”



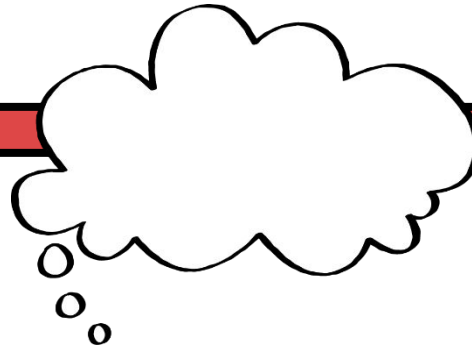
